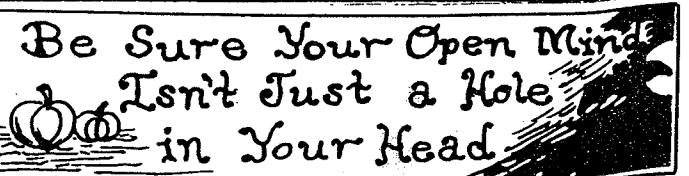
Von FOREVER!

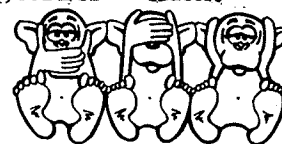

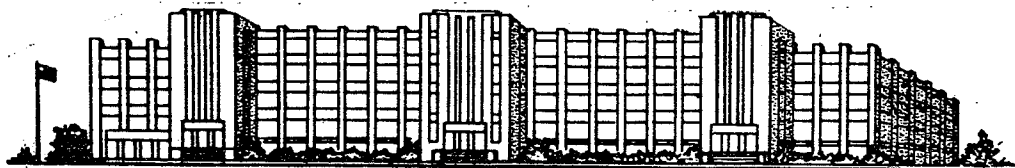
